GUEST ACCESSIBILITY GUIDE

WELCOME TO SIX FLAGS GREAT ESCAPE!

We are glad you are here! At Six Flags Great Escape, we are proud to have earned one of the best safety records in the industry. We are committed to providing our Guests with a safe environment. We want our Guests to have a safe and enjoyable day. We are continuously strive to improve our facilities.

Many amusement park rides incorporate safety systems designed by the manufacturer to accommodate people of average physical stature and body proportion. These safety systems may place restrictions on the ability of an individual to safely experience the ride. Guests of larger or smaller size, Guests who have a history of heart, back, or neck trouble, Guests who are pregnant, Guests who have had recent surgery, or Guests with casts, braces, restrictive devices, or disabilities may not be safely accommodated by these systems. For example, height requirements are based on the size needed for the safety restraints to function properly and the level of maturity usually associated with a certain height.

The Attraction Accessibility Program has been developed using our past experiences and our evaluation of each ride in both normal and emergency operating conditions. We also work closely with the manufacturer of each ride and our policies incorporate the manufacturers' guidelines as well as the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act. We hope that this Guide will help Guests make the best choices to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience at the park. Our goal is to safely and efficiently accommodate the needs of all Guests, including individuals with disabilities.

Our prime consideration is the ability of each person to endure the dynamics of a ride without risk of injury to that person or other riders. If you have a suggestion for an improvement or have questions not answered in this brochure, please stop at Guest Relations. If you feel that you or a member of your party may be affected by this policy, you are encouraged to visit Guest Relations to obtain a list of rides you can safely ride. Your Rider Access Form will provide information for our Team Members to help accommodate you.

RIDE SAFELY

While all amusement attractions have associated risks, certain individuals are at increased risk for injury from these attractions. Carefully evaluate each attraction to determine if you or members of your party can safely participate. We reserve the right to deny access to a ride to anyone who we feel may not be able to safely experience the ride or may be a hazard to other Riders.

A Safety Guide sign is posted at every ride entrance and Alternate Access entrance. These signs provide height requirements, health restrictions, ride ratings, ride accessibility, and special instructions regarding the ride. Please review these signs prior to accessing the ride and follow all instructions provided.

In general, all Guests should be in good health and free from any conditions known or unknown that might be aggravated by riding. If you have any doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride, we urge you to consult with our staff at Hospitality. Remember, if you suspect your health could be at risk for any reason, or if you could aggravate a pre-existing condition of any kind, **DO NOT RIDE.**

Generally, Guests must have the ability to brace themselves upright in the seat and support their head and neck during the ride movements. Guests using wheelchairs will have to transfer from their wheelchair to the ride unit by themselves or be assisted by a member of their party in order to be able to ride. You should plan your visit with someone who can physically help you when necessary.

As a Guest, you are responsible for your own safety. Please read this guide and all instructional signage before riding. Listen to and follow all operator instructions. Any person who intentionally removes a safety restraint, violates a park safety policy, or appears to be under the influence of alcohol or chemical intoxicants will be removed from the park without refund. **For your safety, do not enter an unauthorized area for any reason.** You may be seriously injured if you enter an unauthorized area.






Before riding, please note all safety warnings for each ride. In general:

- Follow all proper Rider positioning until the ride comes to a complete stop.
- All restraint systems, including lap bars, shoulder harnesses, and seatbelts, must be positioned, fastened, and tightened at all times.
- Due to the nature of our rides, backpacks, purses, electronics, stuffed animals, jewelry, and other loose items are not permitted on most rides. Glasses must be secured. Smaller items may be secured in cargo pockets or waist packs as long as they do not interfere with the restraint system. In addition, smaller items may be left in a locker or with a non-Rider. Six Flags Great Escape is not responsible for lost or stolen items. You are responsible for your personal property.
- Due to the nature of our rides, picture taking, cell phone, or electronic usage while riding is prohibited on most rides.
- Keep all parts of your body inside the ride unit at all times.
- Appropriate clothing and shoes are required for most rides. Six Flags Great Escape reserves the right to determine the appropriateness of riding attire.
- Finish food and drink before boarding.
- Smoking, including e-cigarettes, is not permitted in Six Flags Great Escape.

RIDE RATING SYSTEM







A Ride Rating System has been designed which provides a scale for rating the thrill factor of each ride. The intent is to provide a scale to guide park Guests in determining which attractions to ride based on their own experience level, physical condition, and abilities.

Each ride/attraction is placed into one of five categories:

CATEGORY		DESCRIPTION
Low Thrill Rides		Rides that are generally calm and gentle in nature.
Mild Thrill Rides		Rides that generally have low speeds with gentle motion and braking. Rides have smooth transitions with some changes in elevation and speed.
Moderate Thrill Rides		Rides that generally have low to medium speeds and/or heights with moderate motion and braking. Riders may encounter unexpected changes in direction and/or speed during portions of the ride.
High Thrill Rides		Rides that generally have medium to high speeds and/or heights with moderate to rapid braking. Riders may encounter unexpected changes in speed, direction, and/or elevation.
Aggressive Thrill Rides		Rides that generally have one or more of the following: high speeds and/or heights, aggressive and unexpected forces, and rapid directional or elevation change. Riders will encounter many unexpected rapid changes in speed, direction and/or elevation.

ACCESS SYMBOLS

Symbols indicate boarding procedures for each ride and are defined below:



This symbol is used to identify rides where Riders may remain in their wheelchair. Riders may remain in their wheelchair on the Grand Carousel.



This symbol identifies rides that can accommodate Guests who are able to transfer from the wheelchair to the ride unit by themselves or assisted by a member of their party.



This symbol identifies rides where Guests must be able to walk independently or be assisted by a member of their party.

DEFINITIONS

Every ride entrance lists height requirements and special instructions regarding the ride. Six Flags Great Escape uses the following terms:



Ability to hold on or brace: Ability to use one's arms to maintain a grasp on an assist bar and support one's body during normal and emergency procedures on a ride and to use one's legs to brace to maintain a seated position during the forces of the ride.



Hand-held Infant: Hand-held infants are children who are unable to independently walk or maintain seated postural control and will only be able to ride the following rides with a Supervising Companion: Grand Carousel, Storytown Train, Shipwreck Cove, Adventure River, and Hurricane Bay (water depth maybe constricted). Hand-held infants and their Supervising Companion may also enjoy Buccaneer Beach but may not participate on the elevated sections of the attractions.



Supervising Companion: Many of our rides have height requirements that allow a Guest under that requirement to ride with a Supervising Companion. A Supervising Companion is a Companion who is at least 54" in height and approximately 14 years of age, who meets all other criteria for riding, and who will assist their Companion in complying with safe participation instructions. Supervising Companions are responsible for ensuring that the accompanied Rider remains seated properly where applicable and follows all rules and regulations. The Supervising Companion must be seated in the same seat (or row) as the Rider who needs accompaniment and can accompany the number of Riders for which the seat is designed. For example, if a seat is designed for three people, the Supervising Companion can accompany two Riders.

HEALTH RESTRICTIONS



Each ride is evaluated against five primary health restrictions. These restrictions are:

- Back Trouble
- Heart Trouble/High Blood Pressure
- Neck Trouble
- Pregnancy
- Recent Surgery

If you are in doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride or would like more information, please review the information for each attraction in this Guest Assistance Guide or review the Safety Guide and all warning signs posted at each ride entrance and Alternate Access Entrances.

PREGNANCY

Guests who know or believe they may be pregnant should follow all rules, guidelines, and restrictions listed for each ride. Those who are pregnant should not ride a ride that specifically lists pregnancy as a Rider restriction. Please review all rules and guidelines at the entrance of each ride.

Guests who are pregnant may ride Grand Carousel, Storytown Train, and Swan Boats.

HEIGHT REQUIREMENTS

Height requirements and specific instructions are posted at the entrance to each attraction. Guests may be officially measured at Hospitality. The measured Guest will be given a wristband to indicate their height range. Wristbands are not required to ride. They are intended to make your wait in line shorter by streamlining the Guest height measurement process.

To accurately measure Guests, a height measuring device may be used during the height measuring process. This device may come into contact with the Guest's head for a brief period.

For the safety of Guests, shoes that contribute excessively to a Guest's height are prohibited during measuring. For example, a Guest is not permitted to wear platform shoes to help meet a height requirement. Six Flags Great Escape reserves the right to ask that shoes be removed to ensure that a Guest's height is not being artificially enhanced or manipulated.

In Hurricane Harbor, height measurements are taken in bare feet.

ATTRACTION ACCESSIBILITY PROGRAM

We are proud of our reputation for accommodating Guests with disabilities through our Attraction Accessibility Program. To provide equal access for all Guests, we have developed a program which allows Guests with mobility restrictions or cognitive impairment to access attractions. Information about where Guests access the ride is posted on each attraction's Safety Guide sign. All Guests are required to meet all riding requirements for every attraction, including height and health restrictions in order to safely ride/participate.

The Guest with a mobility restriction or cognitive impairment should visit Hospitality upon their arrival at the park to express their inability to wait in the regular line. Some questions are asked to ensure that the Guest has the required physical criteria in order to safely experience attractions. Following that conversation, the Guest Services Associate will provide the details needed to participate in the program.

Guests with mobility restrictions or cognitive impairments who request reasonable accommodations are encouraged to obtain the IBCCES Accessibility Card (IAC) by registering at **accessibilitycard.org** or via the Accessibility Card mobile App. Once a Guest has filled out the online application and uploaded necessary documentation into a secure online portal, they will be able to access their digital Accessibility Card. Guests will present the IBCCES Accessibility Card to Six Flags Great Escape upon their arrival at the park to express their accommodation needs. Some questions are asked to ensure that the Guest has the required physical criteria in order to safely experience attractions. Following that conversation, the Hospitality Associate will provide the details needed to participate in the program.

Note: Only IBCCES can issue the IBCCES Accessibility Card, not Six Flags Great Escape.

CASTS AND BRACES

Guests with casts and braces will be restricted from rides where the cast or brace will not fit inside the ride unit or where it will present a hazard to the Guest or others. Guests with full arm (elbow restricted) and full leg (knee restricted) casts or braces are restricted from most rides and water slides. We suggest you delay your visit until the cast is removed. Casts and braces with exposed metal parts are not permitted on most slides in Hurricane Harbor.

The following chart displays the cast and brace rules for all rides and attractions.

- C** Must ride in a chariot
- F** Cast/brace must fit safely in the ride unit
- O** Not permitted to participate on elevated activity area
- Y** May ride with the condition
- Z** Participation or water depth may be restricted if necessary

PROSTHESIS

Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride any attraction unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride. Guests must also be able to maintain proper riding posture. Prosthetic devices with exposed metal parts are prohibited on most attractions. Guests are encouraged to visit designated park locations for assistance before riding to ensure a safe experience.

Guests with any type of prosthesis are advised to consult with the Six Flags Great Escape Supervisory Team for guidance during their visit.

- Rides where prosthesis are not permitted:
Adirondack Outlaw, Extreme Supernova, Greezed Lightnin', and Pandemonium.

RIDE DEVICES

For safety reasons, certain attractions may require the removal of medical devices or prosthetics that are not securely fastened to the Rider's body. These devices may interfere with safety restraints, prevent proper riding posture, or pose hazards to the Guest or others.

On rides equipped with removable seats, Guests using wheelchairs may transfer directly to the ride vehicle. Ride attendants and Guest service staff are available to assist with questions or specific requirements regarding harnesses, mobility aids, or prosthetic devices.

Safety is the park's highest priority. To ensure an enjoyable and safe experience, Guests who do not meet specific Rider requirements, including those related to harnesses and mobility aids, may be restricted from participating.

Additional lists are available for:

- Body Harnesses, when requested, allow certain Guests with disabilities the ability to ride if they meet the ride criteria. The following rides are equipped with a body harness: Balloon Race; Blizzard; Cannonball Express; Canyon Blaster; Condor; Convoy; Extreme Supernova; Frankie's Mine Train; Grand Carousel; Greezed Lightnin'; Hootie's Treehouse; Island Air Adventures; Oakley's Honey Swings; Pandemonium; Ranger Randy's Scenic Railway; Rocky's Ranger Planes; Sasquatch Launch; Sasquatch Drop; Screamin' Eagles; Sheldon's Speedway; Sky Ride, Spruce's Wilderness Bus Tours; Steamin' Demon; and Thunder Alley.
- In addition, specific ride vehicles are equipped with removable sides at Greezed Lightnin'. These vehicles may further assist Riders in transferring from their wheelchair to the ride unit. Please inform an Associate at the ride if you wish to use that vehicle.

For additional guidance, Guests are encouraged to consult the park guide or speak with a Ride Attendant or Guest Relations Associate.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Our goal is to make Six Flags Great Escape as enjoyable and barrier-free as practical. Listed below are some of the services we offer. Please feel free to suggest areas in which we might improve in the future.



Braille & Large Print Guest Accessibility Guides

Print versions of the Park Guide and Guest Accessibility Guide are available at Hospitality. Braille and large print versions are also available. There are a limited number of print guides which are obtainable on a first-come, first-served basis.



Family Services

A space for nursing mothers is available at the Baby Care center in Carousel Plaza. Baby changing areas and a companion restroom can be found in most restrooms. Please feel free to ask an Associate for directions to these locations or review a park map.



First Aid

Our First Aid Building/Station/Center located next to Dare Devil Dive is staffed from park open to park close. Medical equipment storage and refrigeration for Guests with medication is offered at First Aid. In addition, a First Aid Station is located in Hurricane Harbor at Hurricane Bay. Emergency medical care is available for overnight Guests.



Hearing Needs

Assistive listening devices are available upon request. These lightweight, wireless devices amplify sounds using signals from transmitters located throughout the park and are recommended for Guests with mild to moderate hearing loss. For more details or to obtain a device, please visit Hospitality.

If you require American Sign Language (ASL) interpreting services, we can provide them with at least **seven days'** advance notice for live show venues, and/or to accompany you for the day. Additionally, show scripts or score sheets can also be requested at each venue. Parking

Accessible parking is available on a first-come, first-served basis within the main parking lots of the park. When you arrive at the parking toll booths, ask an Associate for instructions regarding where to proceed to the accessible parking lot. Both auto and van accessible spaces are provided. A valid disability parking placard or license plate must be displayed at all times while parked in the designated accessible parking area. If the designated accessible parking area is full at the time of your arrival, members of your party may be dropped off at the main pick-up/drop-off area, near the main entrance to the park. Proper vehicle identification must be displayed. Security Officers on duty are authorized to ticket and/or tow vehicles that do not display proper identification. Please ask an Associate for directions to additional parking areas.



Restrooms

Private restroom facilities for Guests needing the assistance of a companion are available at Red Garter Corral and Security Screening. Wheelchair accessible stalls are located at all restrooms with the exception of Red Garter Corral. For your convenience, we also have a family restroom available Red Garter Corral and Security Screening.



Rider Swap

The Rider Swap program allows one adult to stay with non-Riders while the rest enjoy the ride. Upon their return, they can switch with the waiting adult, who can ride without joining the regular queue. For more information, visit Hospitality near the Front Gate.



Service Animals

Service animals are welcome at Six Flags Great Escape. A service animal is defined as a dog that has been individually trained to do work or perform tasks for a person with disabilities. Examples of such work or tasks include: guiding people who are blind; alerting people who are deaf; pulling a wheelchair; alerting and protecting a person who is having a seizure; reminding a person with mental illness to take prescribed medications; calming a person with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) during an anxiety attack; or performing other duties. Service animals are working animals, not pets. The work or task a dog has been trained to provide must be directly related to the person's disability. Dogs whose sole function is to provide comfort or emotional support do not qualify as service animals.

Service animals must be housebroken, controlled with a restraining device, and display appropriate behavior at all times while on our property. Guests whose service animal demonstrates aggressive and/or inappropriate actions toward a Guest or Associate will be directed to remove the animal from the park. There is a limit of one service animal per Guest.

Due to the nature of most rides, service animals must remain with a non-riding member of your party. We are not permitted to take control of your service animal. Service animals may be taken on: Convoy; Grand Carousel; Thunder Alley; Spruce's Wilderness Bus Tours; Storytown Train; and Swan Boats.

Service animals must be leashed, under the owner's control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle, and seated on the floor, not the ride seat. They may also attend the performances at Carousel Plaza and Storytown Stage. Service animals are not permitted in water attractions, wet decks, wading pools, or lazy rivers. They are permitted to walk through the park areas, including scare zones. Visit Hospitality for more information. Guests may take advantage of our Rider Swap policy for staying with the service animal. Visit Guest Services for more information.

A Service Animal Relief Area is located in the grassy area next to the First Aid Building. Owners are responsible for disposing of their animal's waste.



Special Dietary Needs

Although outside food and beverages are not allowed in the park, individuals who have special diets or need items due to a medical condition may bring small coolers to accommodate such needs. Please visit Guest Services for more information.



Wheelchairs & Electric Convenience Vehicles

A limited supply of wheelchairs, electric convenience vehicles (ECV), and strollers are available for rent at the Main Gate or at the General Store. ECVs can also be rented at the Lodge on the Lake. However, since wheelchairs, ECVs, and strollers are rented on a first-come, first-served basis and cannot be reserved in advance, we urge Guests to bring their own. Rentals are also available at the park while supplies last.

Wheelchairs, ECVs, and strollers may not be taken out of the park gates or to the parking lot. However, a park Team Member will be happy to provide any assistance you may need at that time. For any Guest using a personal Segway, please stop by Guest Relations prior to entering the park.

GUESTS USING WHEELCHAIRS & ECV'S

Guests who choose to use a wheelchair or ECV, we require a safe speed be maintained while traveling in the park.

Wheelchairs and ECVs cannot be accommodated on most rides and attractions, with the exception of Grand Carousel where wheelchairs can be accommodated. If your wheelchair can be safely accommodated on a ride, you are responsible for it being able to withstand the movement of the ride. Please refer to the individual ride and attraction descriptions in the back of this guide for more specific information. For information on water wheelchairs in the waterpark, please see the Water Wheelchair and Pool Lifts section.

On most rides where Guests in wheelchairs can be accommodated, Guests will need to leave their wheelchairs to be seated. In most cases, a wheelchair may be left in a designated position on or near the ride platform or walkway near the ride. Almost every ride is wheelchair accessible. A wheelchair lift is available at Flashback to transport a Guest in a wheelchair to our second story ride platform. If an ECV has attachments to the vehicle which could impede with the operation of a lift or with safe lift ingress and egress, please transfer to a manual wheelchair. Applicable attachments would include canopies, antennae, umbrellas, awnings, etc. Please ask an Associate at each location for assistance.

If in doubt about your ability to safely experience a ride, we urge you to consult with our staff at Hospitality. Six Flags Great Escape personnel are not trained in transferring Guests from wheelchairs to ride units and are not permitted to do so. You should plan your visit with someone who can physically help you when necessary.

EVACUATIONS

Evacuations may be required due to mechanical reasons, weather conditions, or a power interruption. If an evacuation is required, Riders may need to maneuver across catwalks, from the highest point of the ride, and down steeply inclined catwalks or steps. Ride units may also stop at the top of a lift or on the ride course. Certain evacuations may require Riders to use additional safety equipment during the process. Remain seated until given instructions. In Hurricane Harbor, Guests may be asked to evacuate pools as quickly as possible using stairs or ladders. If an evacuation from a ride/attraction is required, Riders requiring assistance during the ride evacuation may be escorted last in order to expedite the ride evacuation process. If so, you accept any risk due to delayed evacuation if we need to physically lift or lower you.

GUESTS OF A LARGER SIZE

All restraint systems, including lap bars, shoulder harnesses, and seatbelts must be positioned and fastened properly to allow Guests to ride. Due to restraint system requirements, Guests of larger size (in terms of height, weight, and/or proportions) may not be accommodated on some of our rides.

Maximum and minimum weight limits can be found under the individual rides in this guide and on the Safety Guide Signs at the entrance to rides with restrictions.

If you are concerned about whether or not you can be accommodated safely on a ride, you may enter the ride via the exit to ensure the restraints function properly prior to waiting in line. The rest of your party may wait for you outside the exit.

LOOSE ARTICLES

Most rides cannot accommodate loose articles including: jewelry; cell phones; hats; cameras; purses; backpacks; basketballs; umbrellas; beverage containers; electronic devices; etc. Items must be safely secured in cargo pockets, a waist pack, in a bin on the ride platform, in a locker, or with a non-Rider. Six Flags Great Escape is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items.

Extra or bulky clothing, backpacks, and anything else that could potentially be between the Rider and the restraint will not be allowed. The restraint mechanism must be secured snugly against the Rider's body.

Using cell phones or other electronic device for any purpose, including picture taking, is prohibited on most rides.

Glasses must be secured on all rides. On Adirondack Outlaw and Dare Devil Dive, glasses must be secured by an athletic strap or they cannot be worn on the ride.

Hearing devices and other electronic devices may be damaged by water at water rides and attractions. Please take necessary precautions to protect hearing devices on all rides. Sensory headphones or helmets may be accommodated on select rides. Please see an Associate for more details.

Any non-compliance which results in damage or injury to a person or property will result in consequences up to and including prosecution.

LOST & FOUND

All items found at Six Flags Great Escape are turned in to Hospitality. If you lose an item on a ride, we will search for the article as soon as possible. In order to keep the ride in operation, an immediate search may not be possible.

Lost articles may be reported online at

For your safety, do not enter unauthorized areas to retrieve lost articles. You can be seriously injured if you enter an unauthorized area.

MAGNETIC FIELDS ON RIDES

Magnetics are used at: The Bobcat and Flashback. Guests with medical devices sensitive to magnetic fields (pacemakers, hearing aids, etc.), should consider these factors when deciding to ride.

OXYGEN TANKS

Due to the dynamic nature of rides, portable oxygen tanks are only permitted on the following rides: Grand Carousel; Storytown Train and Swan Boats; Spruce's Wilderness Bus Tours; and Thunder Alley. The tank must fit safely in the ride unit and not interfere with the ride restraint system. For your convenience, the park's First Aid station(s) will be able to appropriately store your additional oxygen tanks during your visit.

Many rides can accommodate smaller personal oxygen equipment. Personal oxygen equipment that can be secured around the waist, or with a strap that can be worn over the shoulder of one arm and under the other arm, may be permitted as long as the contents of the equipment housing can be contained. The equipment must allow the restraint mechanism to be secured snugly against the Rider's body. The equipment must not prevent Riders from properly sitting in the ride unit with their back and shoulders against the seat back. At no time may the equipment be between the Rider and the seat or the restraint. Riders must be free to hold on during the ride; therefore, nothing may be in their hands while riding.

STROBE LIGHTING & SPECIAL EFFECTS

Many attractions utilize special effects, including but not limited to: haze and other atmospheric effects; scents; areas of low lighting; loud music; sound effects; strobe lighting; and other specialty lighting. Guests with medical conditions that may be impacted by these special effects are advised not to participate in these attractions. Attractions utilizing these effects include: Adirondack Outlaw; The Comet; The Bobcat; Blizzard; Cannonball Express; and Desperado Plunge.

PROPER ATTIRE

For the safety and enjoyment of our Guests, everyone is to adhere to proper dress attire, as most rides require each Guest ride with shirts, shorts, and shoes. Loose clothing (including scarves and other free-flowing clothing) must be fully secured or removed to prevent any interference with the ride restraint system. On Adirondack Outlaw, Dare Devil Dive, and Olympiad Grand Prix, loose clothing will be required to be removed in their entirety. Loose fitting shoes may only be removed before riding Adirondack Outlaw, Oakley's Honey Swings, Sasquatch Launch, Sasquatch Drop, and Sky Ride.

Swimwear is not permitted on rides outside of Hurricane Harbor. Swimwear is required to be appropriate. Thongs or transparent clothing are not permitted.

RIDER CRITERIA

Our Attraction Accessibility Program is designed to allow Guests to participate in the enjoyment of our attractions as much as possible. The program was developed by analyzing the physical and mental attributes required to safely ride each attraction. It is our policy to allow anyone to ride who meets all these requirements and is not a hazard to themselves or others. We continue to evaluate and update our Attraction Accessibility Program as necessary.

The evaluation of each attraction considered the following criteria:

Independent seated postural.

The Guest must have the body and spinal control to sit upright without the aid of other people or devices. The Guest must also have sufficient muscle control to support their head, neck, and upper torso during the course of the ride, including the dynamic motion of the ride. Certain ride units such as carousel horses require the ability to form a saddle posture with the Guest's thighs.

Appropriate center of gravity.

The Guest's body must have the appropriate weight distribution for that ride.

Ability to hold on with one functioning arm.

Guests must have one functioning arm that exhibits good grip control, the ability to brace, and is strong enough to allow the Guest to maintain proper riding position throughout the duration of the ride. A functioning arm may be a natural arm or a prosthesis which can be used for gripping and bracing. Any arm prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prosthesis.

Ability to hold on with two functioning arms.

Guests must have two functioning arms that exhibit good grip control, the ability to brace, and are strong enough to allow the Guest to maintain the proper riding position throughout the duration of the ride. A functioning arm may be a natural arm or a prosthesis which can be used for gripping and bracing. Any arm prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prosthesis.

Ability to brace self with one functioning leg.

Guests must have one functioning leg to be used for bracing the body during the course of the ride. A functioning leg may be a natural leg or a prosthesis used for bracing the body during the course of participation and maintaining balance when entering and exiting a ride unit. Any leg prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prosthesis.

Ability to brace self with two functioning legs.

Guests must have two functioning legs to be used for bracing the body during the course of the ride. A functioning leg may be a natural leg or a prosthesis used for bracing the body during the course of participation and maintaining balance when entering and exiting a ride unit. Any leg prosthesis must remain properly secured under the dynamic forces of the ride. Due to manufacturer requirements, some rides may exclude prosthesis.

Minimum of two functioning extremities.

Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities (two legs, two arms, or one arm and one leg) to brace themselves during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Minimum of three functioning extremities.

Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities (two legs and one arm or two arms and one leg) to brace themselves (with tripod bracing) during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Minimum of four functioning extremities.

Guests must have four functioning extremities (two legs and two arms) to brace themselves during the ride and assist in entering and exiting the ride unit.

Ability to enter/exit the attraction within specified parameters without endangering self or others.

Guests must be able to enter and exit the ride without jeopardizing themselves or others and to assist with their own evacuation, if necessary. This may include special arrangements such as entering through the Alternate Access Entrance or having someone aid in boarding. For the safety of our Associates and Guests, Associates are instructed not to perform any lifting of Guests.

Appropriate observed behavior.

Guest demonstrates appropriate observed behavior indicating a willingness and ability to participate and/or follow Guest requirements. Appropriate observed behavior may include, but not be limited to, maintaining proper riding position, attention and compliance to safety instructions, proper use of all ride safety equipment, and willingness to participate.

Guests have a duty to:

- Exercise good judgment
- Act in a responsible manner while using amusement rides
- Not participate while under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- Properly use all ride safety equipment provided

RIDES

The following descriptions are designed to give you information on the type of actions caused by various rides. Each of the following attractions will identify the restrictions according to the criteria itemized above. **In order to participate on most attractions, Guests must have seated postural control, appropriate center of gravity, appropriate observed behavior, and the ability to enter and exit the ride safely.** Specific exceptions or qualifications to those four criteria will be noted in the information provided below. If you have been authorized for Alternate Access, follow the directions listed under each ride.

Adirondack Outlaw 5



Guests must be at least 50" tall to ride.

A thrill ride that catapults Riders upside down both forward and backward. Riders will experience changes in direction and elevation as well as moments of weightlessness while aboard the ride.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each Rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Riders of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities that includes one functioning arm with a hand. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest is able to form a saddle posture with leg residual limbs sufficient to brace self upright in the seat. Casts are not permitted on this ride. Prosthetics are not permitted on this ride. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride without the prosthetic.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. A transfer device is available upon request which may assist a Guest out of a wheelchair and into the ride unit.

NOTE: Loose articles are not permitted. Loose articles can be left in a bin or with a non-Rider.

NOTE: Glasses may only be worn on this attraction if they are secured with an athletic strap. Glasses may not be held in the hands while riding.

Balloon Race 2



Guests must be at least 48" tall to ride alone **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

Hot air balloon ride that spins and raises Riders in the air.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. A door further encloses the ride unit.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collarbone are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Blizzard ▲ 3



Guests must be at least 48" tall to ride alone **or** 36" tall and accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Maximum Weight – 510 lb. per car.

Rotating cars are mounted on counter-rotating arms, which produces strong accelerations and side-to-side movement, changing force and direction rapidly.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar and seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. The smaller Rider must sit on the inside seat.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests may have two functioning legs instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

Bucket Blasters ● 1



Guests must be at least 48" to ride alone. Guest between 36" and 48" must be accompanied by a supervising companion.

A slow-moving circular ride with splashes!

Restraint System: A door with a safety lock secures all Riders in a cabin.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or any leg cast (foot, lower, full) are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Watch your step, as the ride unit may be slippery and wet.

Cannonball Express ▲ 3



Guests must be at least 52" tall to ride alone **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

Maximum Height for guests is 78".

Maximum Weight – 495 lb. per car.

This is a circular ride where cars move up and down on a rotating table. Riders will experience acceleration and side-to-side movement.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar and seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. The smaller Rider must sit on the inside seat.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to support weight against the restraint under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests may have two functioning legs instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride. Alternatively, guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness provided the Guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness. Guests with any upper extremity prosthesis must ensure the device is properly secured or removed prior to riding. Leg prosthesis at or above the ankle are not permitted.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

Canyon Blaster



Guests must be at least 48" tall to ride alone **or** 42" and accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

A moderately exciting family roller coaster with drops and high-speed turns.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Comet



Guests must be at least 48" tall to ride.

A high-speed wooden roller coaster with a combination of banked turns and airtime bumps.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar and seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting.

Condor 3



Guests must be at least 54" tall to ride alone **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Rotating cars are mounted on counter-rotating tower that climbs to 105 ft, which produces strong accelerations and side-to-side movement, changing force and direction rapidly.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. The smaller Rider must sit ahead of the larger Rider within the seat.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm, and one functioning leg.

Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Alternatively, guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness provided the guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness. Guests with any upper extremity prosthesis must ensure the device is properly secured or removed prior to riding. Leg prosthesis at or above the ankle are not permitted.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up into the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

NOTE: Loose articles are not permitted. Loose articles can be left in a bin or with a non-Rider.

Convoy 1



Guests must be at least 36" tall to ride alone **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

This ride only accommodates one adult per truck. The adult must sit in the back seat.

This ride is a miniature truck ride that follows an electric track in a "train-like" fashion.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis. A door encloses the ride unit in the front row.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm with a hand and one functioning leg with a foot. Alternatively, Guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness, provided the Guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness. Guests with any extremity prosthesis must ensure the device is properly secured or removed prior to riding.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into a suspended seat. Service animals must be leashed, under the owner's control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle, and seated on the floor, not the ride seat.

NOTE: Bulky loose articles are not permitted. Those loose articles can be left in a bin or with a non-Rider.

Dare Devil Dive



Guests must be at least 42" tall to ride.

Maximum Weight – 850 lb. per flight.

Dare Devil Dive is a high-thrill Skycoaster attraction made to simulate flight. Riders are hoisted 175 feet into the air. They control their own ride experience by pulling the ripcord, initiating their tethered freefall descent and flight. The sensation of flight throughout the ride is similar to skydiving and hang gliding, with Riders reaching speeds up to 60 miles per hour.

Restraint System: Riders wear a full body harness that supports the Rider in a prone position. The harness is connected to the flight support cables.

Rider Criteria: Guests are required to have a minimum of one functioning leg and, by reason of the restraint system inherent in the flight suit, it is necessary that the Rider possesses two arms sufficient for proper functioning of the flight suit. Lower extremities must be of sufficient enough length to be contained and restrained by a leg strap. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access available via the ride entrance. Riders must be able to walk independently or be assisted by a member of their party.

NOTE: This is an extra charge attraction.

NOTE: Glasses may only be worn on this attraction if they are secured with an athletic strap. Glasses may not be held in the hands while riding.

Desperado Plunge



Guests must be at least 46" tall to ride alone **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

This is a water flume ride; Riders may get wet. Riders will be seated in a rocking boat and brace for a plunge down a chute and a splash of water.

Rider Criteria: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping down into the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting. Watch your step, as the ride unit may be slippery and wet.

WARNING: Boats may bump into the side of channel and other boats.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting

Extreme Supernova



Riders must be at least 48" tall to ride.

A ride with oscillating up and down motion.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with safety belt secures each Rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Riders of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests must have a minimum of one full functioning leg (excluding prosthesis). Guests must have one arm with naturally functioning hand. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Alternatively, Guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness provided the Guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the ride unit may shift. Do not use the ride restraints for support as they will shift.

Flashback



Guests must be at least 48" tall **and** under 80" tall to ride.

A high-speed, looping roller coaster which turns Riders upside down multiple times forward, and then again while traveling backward. Riders will experience weightlessness and rapid movements from side-to-side.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness secures each Rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have sufficient upper body extremities maintaining proper Rider positioning. Must have two legs, of which only the feet may be missing or a minimum of one natural leg including (partial) foot and one upper leg which extends to the end of the seat is required. The required lower extremities may be paralyzed. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Arm prosthesis are not permitted on this ride. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride without the prosthetic.

Rider Access: Alternate Access available via the ride entrance. Riders must be able to walk independently or be assisted by a member of their party. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Frankie's Mine Train



Guests must be at least 42" tall **and** under 54" tall to ride.

Guests 54" need to be accompanied by a child under 54".

A junior steel roller coaster with mild drops, bumps, and turns. Riders will experience changes in speed and direction, weightlessness, and rapid movements from side-to-side.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar and seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Riders of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride. Alternatively, guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness provided the guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Specific ride vehicles at this attraction are equipped with removable sides which may assist a Guest in transferring from their wheelchair to the ride unit. Please inform an Associate if you wish to use that vehicle. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

NOTE: Glasses may only be worn on this attraction if they are secured with an athletic strap. Glasses may not be held in the hands of Riders while riding.

Hootie's Treehouse 2



Guests must be at least 36" tall to ride. Guests over 54" tall must be accompanied by a child.

This ride only accommodates two adults per ride.

This is a family tower ride where Riders are propelled to the top and bounce down to the platform. Riders will experience weightlessness and rapidly changing forces and directions.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar and seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size. Adults must sit on the two outside seats.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm (excluding prosthesis) and one functioning leg. Guests must have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains them. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Island Air Adventure 2



Guests must be between 48" to ride alone; Guests under 48" must have a Supervising Companion.

This ride only accommodates two adults per plane.

A slow-moving plane ride that goes up and down as the ride rotates around in a circle. Riders can use a button to control the elevation of their unit.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities. Guests must have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride's restraint system adequately restrains them.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit.

Marshal's Stampede 2



Guests must be at least 48" tall to ride.

A bumper car ride where Riders drive cars one way around a circular track. Riders will experience strong side-to-side movement and rapidly changing direction and forces.

Restraint System: An individual shoulder strap is positioned across the chest and under the arm of each Rider.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Oakley's Honey Swings 2



Guests must be at least 36" tall to ride alone **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

Maximum Weight - 275 lb. per swing.

This ride only accommodates one adult per swing.

Chair swing children's ride with free hanging seats suspended from an elevated, rotating, and slanting tower. Riders will rotate in a circular motion as the tower begins to rise.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar is positioned above the laps of all Riders in the row with an individual between-the-legs safety belt. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of three functioning extremities if the guest has a normal center of gravity and lower extremities are sufficiently strong to maintain proper riding posture under the dynamic conditions of the ride. Amputations must be at the knee or below. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Alternatively, Guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness, provided the guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into a suspended seat. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Olympiad Grand Prix 3



Guests must be at least 58" tall to drive **or** 40" tall to ride with a legal parent or guardian 18 years of age or older.

This is a "drive-yourself" go-kart ride where Drivers drive their own go-kart around a designated track.

Restraint System: A four-point seat belt secures each Rider across the upper body and waist. Passenger must sit in the passenger seat unless they meet the Rider requirements for the Driver.

Rider Criteria: Drivers must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; one functioning arm and two functioning legs. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Drivers must exhibit sufficient visual acuity to operate the car safely. Long hair must be tied up above the shoulder. Alternatively, Guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness, provided the guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the exit. Guests will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit.

NOTE: This is an extra charge attraction.

NOTE: Loose articles are not permitted. Loose articles can be left in a bin or with a non-Rider.

Pandemonium



Guests must be at least 48" tall to ride.

An exciting ride with circulating up and down motions.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each Rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Riders of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Must have arms that extend at a minimum to the elbow and non-prosthetic functioning hand on one of the two arms. Prosthetic must be removed to ride. Must have sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains them. Both legs must include the knee. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, or braced arm casts are not permitted. Alternatively, Guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness, provided the guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Raging River 3



Guests must be at least 48" tall to ride alone **or** 42" tall and accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

A family water attraction where Riders travel in rafts along a man-made river full of rapids, geysers, canyons, and waterfalls. Rafts float and bounce down high speed rapids, often rotating rapidly after impacting with the bank of the river. Riders will get wet.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps along a moving turntable, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping down into the ride unit. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting. Watch your step, as the ride unit may be slippery and wet.

CAUTION: Boats may bump into the side of channel and other boats.

Ranger Randy's Scenic Railway 3



Guests must be at least 36" tall to ride or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests over 54" must be accompanied by a child. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

Replica of an old steam-powered locomotive. Guests sit in a train that travels in Timbertown.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, lower leg cast or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Rocky's Ranger Planes 1



Guests must be between 36" and 54" tall to ride.

A slow-moving plane ride that goes up and down as the ride rotates around in a circle. Riders can use a joystick to control the elevation of their unit.

Restraint System: An individual seatbelt secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, or braced arm casts are not permitted.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and over the side of the ride unit.

Sasquatch 4



Guests must be at least 48" tall to ride.

A tower ride with a chair lift-type seat where Riders are propelled up or shot down at high speeds. Guests will experience the feeling of weightlessness and elevation change as they ascend and descend each ride tower.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness with a between-the-legs safety belt secures each Rider over the head and across the chest. An additional safety belt is secured around the Rider's waist. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have at least one functioning arm and sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains them. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Guests with any type of prosthesis should not ride unless they can ensure the device is properly secured and will remain in place during the ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into a suspended seat. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

NOTE: Glasses may only be worn on this attraction if they are secured with an athletic strap. Glasses may not be held in the hands while riding.

Screamin Eagles 3



Guests must be at least 44" tall to ride alone **or** 36" tall and accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Maximum Weight - 340 lb. per car.

Guests ride in suspended cars that rotate in a circle. Once the ride's speed increases, Riders use a fin on the front of the car to steer the car higher or lower.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. The smaller Rider must sit on the inside seat.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Guests must have a minimum of one full functioning leg (including prosthesis) and one leg amputated below the knee. Guests with a cervical collar or neck brace are not permitted to ride. Guests who do not demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of elevating themselves up into the seat. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Sheldon's Speedway 2



Guests must be at least 36" tall to ride alone **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

This ride only accommodates one adult per car.

This children's ride allows Guests to ride in their own car that whips around an oblong track.

Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have at least one functioning arm and sufficient lower extremities to ensure the ride restraint system adequately restrains them. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, or braced arm cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Sky Ride 2



Guest must be at least 48" tall to ride alone **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

A cable car ride with gondolas suspended from an overhead moving cable.

Restraint System: A shared overhead lap bar with a safety lock with an individual safety bar that goes between Riders' legs.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have at least one functioning arm with a minimum of two functioning extremities. Guests must have appropriate center of gravity, appropriate seated postural control, and appropriate observed behavior. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collarbone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride. Alternatively, Guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness, provided the Guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Riders will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting.

Spruce's Wilderness Bus Tours 2



Guests must be at least 36" tall to ride alone **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests over 54" must be accompanied by an child. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

This ride only accommodates one adult per row.

Bus with six rows that seats four guests per row. The bus rotates both in a clockwise and counter-clockwise direction reaching a height of over 20 feet.

Restraint System: A shared lap bar secures all Riders in the row. A door further encloses the ride unit.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm (excluding prosthesis) and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar or neck brace are not permitted to ride. Guests who do not demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Alternatively, Guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness, provided the guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up into the ride unit. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift. Service animals must be leashed, under the owner's control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle, and seated on the floor, not the ride seat.

Steamin' Demon



Guests must be at least 48" tall to ride.

A high-speed, looping roller coaster which turns Riders upside down three times. Riders will experience weightlessness and rapid movements from side-to-side.

Restraint System: A shoulder harness secures each Rider over the head and across the chest. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities; one functioning arm and one functioning leg. Two functioning arms are sufficient instead of one functioning arm and one functioning leg if the Guest is able to form a saddle posture with leg residual limbs sufficient to brace themselves upright in the seat. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Alternatively, Guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness, provided the guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

Storytown Train 1



Guests must be at least 42" tall to ride alone **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Riders board an antique train that offers a round trip through the park.

Rider Criteria: Guests who do not have independent seated postural control, appropriate observed behavior, or hand-held infants must ride in the center of the bench with a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Service animals must be leashed, under the owner's control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle, and seated on the floor, not the ride seat.

Swan Boats 1



Guests must be at least 42" tall to ride alone **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Swan Boats takes a round trip boat ride along the historic River Dee.

Rider Criteria: Guests who do not have independent seated postural control, appropriate observed behavior, or hand-held infants must ride in the center of the bench with a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution, as the ride unit may shift when entering and exiting. Service animals must be leashed, under the owner's control, fit on the floor of the ride vehicle, and seated on the floor, not the ride seat.

The Bobcat 4



Guests must be at least 48" tall to ride alone. Guests between 42" and 48" must ride with a Supervising Companion.

The Bobcat is a wooden roller coaster with sudden twists, turns, and drops.

Restraint System: An individual lap bar secures each Rider across the thighs and pelvis. Due to the nature of the restraint, this ride may not accommodate Guests of a larger size.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Alternatively, Guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness, provided the guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to transfer into the seat, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please do not use the ride restraints for support while entering and exiting, as they will shift.

WARNING: This ride contains strobe lighting

Thunder Alley 2



Guests must be at least 42" tall to ride **or** accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants are not permitted.

An antique-styled car ride that slowly travels through a scenic journey on a designated track.






Restraint System: A shared seatbelt secures all Riders in the row across the thighs and pelvis.

Rider Criteria: Guests must have at least one functioning arm or one functioning leg. Guests must also have the ability to maintain seated postural control and demonstrate appropriate observed behavior. Guests who do not meet these requirements must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Alternatively, Guests with certain amputations may be able to ride with the use of a separate full body harness, provided the guest has remaining leg and arm residual limbs to be secured by the harness. Guests should check with Guest Services to determine if they are eligible to ride using the full body harness.

Rider Access: Alternate Access is available at the ride exit. Guests will have to take several steps, on their own or with the assistance of a companion, and be capable of stepping up and into the seat of the ride unit.

HURRICANE HARBOR

Each attraction is placed into one of five categories:

CATEGORY	DESCRIPTION
Low Thrill Rides	 This is a low speed, and/or shallow water attraction.
Mild Thrill Rides	 This is a low to medium speed attraction, and/or water depth to 48 inches. Some Rider control, maneuvering and/or swimming skills required.
Moderate Thrill Rides	 This is a medium speed attraction. Height and water depth may vary. Moderate or unexpected forces can be generated during the ride. This attraction may require Rider control and/or strong swimming skills. Physical activity may be strenuous.
High Thrill Rides	 This is a fast paced ride experience. Riders will encounter changes in speed, direction, elevation, strong water currents, and/or depth of water, some of which is unexpected. This attraction requires Rider body control and strong swimming skills.
Aggressive Thrill Rides	 This is a high speed and/or deep water attraction with turbulent turns, drops and/or strong water currents with changes in speed, direction, elevation and/or deep water, which may be unexpected. This attraction requires Rider body control and swimming skills.



Appropriate Attire

Appropriate swimwear is required. Thongs and transparent clothing are not permitted. We reserve the right to determine the appropriateness of swimwear. Guests wearing bathing attire with metal buttons, rivets, zippers, or snaps will not be permitted to ride Bamboo Shoots, Big Kahuna, Bonzai Pipeline, Paradise Plunge, Tornado, or Wahoo Racer. Jewelry including, but not limited to, necklaces, bracelets, dangling earrings, and rings other than wedding bands are prohibited on Bonzai Pipeline and Paradise Plunge. Contact lenses are not recommended. Guests requiring special accommodation should speak to a member of the Aquatics Supervisory Team.



Life Jackets

Life jackets are available for all Guests. Only U.S. Coast Guard (or Canada) approved life jackets are allowed as floatation devices. Life jackets are provided free of charge for Guests who require one.

In wave pools, life jackets are required for Guests who are less than 52" tall in bare feet, participants with a history of seizures (or similar medical conditions), heart conditions, or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers. Children who are less than 42" tall must wear life jackets and be accompanied by Supervising Companions. This policy will be enforced at Hurricane Bay.

In other attractions requiring life jackets, children who are less than 48" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers must wear a life jacket. Children who are less than 42" tall must wear life jackets and be accompanied by Supervising Companions. This policy will be enforced at Adventure River.



Ongoing Lifeguard Training

In an ongoing effort to provide a safe and enjoyable waterpark experience for our Guests, Hurricane Harbor routinely utilizes training exercises to improve our lifeguards' skills and vigilance. These exercises will occur during normal operating hours and may consist of the following: submersible water manikins, the use of video surveillance equipment, internal and external audits, and active/inactive water rescues and/or first aid scenarios.



Swim Diapers

Guests who require a diaper are required to wear swim diapers or a diaper specifically designed for aquatic use.

WATERPARK ATTRACTIONS

The following descriptions are designed to give you information on the types of actions caused by various attractions. **In order to participate on most attractions, Guests must have seated postural control, appropriate center of gravity, appropriated observed behavior, and the ability to enter and exit the attraction safely.**

Specific exceptions or qualifications to those four criteria will be noted in the information provided below. If you have been authorized for Alternate Access, follow the directions listed under each attraction. Please use caution when entering and exiting waterpark attractions as the surrounding areas may be slippery. Conveying devices such as tubes and rafts may be slippery and can shift during loading and unloading.

Adventure River 1



Children must be at least 42" tall in bare feet to ride alone **or** be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Children under 48" tall in bare feet or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers are required to wear a life jacket. A Supervising Companion may accompany up to two children

A slow-moving river tube ride/attraction.

Rider Criteria: Guests must be able to safely enter/exit the attraction and demonstrate appropriate observed behavior, or be accompanied by a supervising companion. Guests without one functioning arm, one functioning leg, the ability to maintain seated postural control, or the ability to demonstrate appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a supervising companion and wear a lifejacket. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero-depth entry. Riders will have to transfer to the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Bamboo Shoots 4



Guests must be at least 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 250 lb.

Three separate slides. One slide is totally enclosed twisting slide that only single Guests may ride in a single tube. One partially enclosed slide that only single Guests may ride in a single tube. The last slide is a drop slide that only single riders may ride in a single tube. All three slides end in a 36" deep catch pool.

Rider Criteria: Riders must be seated in the tube with feet in the middle, facing forward, sitting up straight, and holding on to both handles. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, forearm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing a few steps. Riders will have to be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the tube may shift. The tube and surrounding area may also be slippery.

Big Kahuna



Guests must be at least 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 250 lb. per Rider and 400 lb per tube.

A thrilling tube slide where Riders descend down a darkened enclosed flume before exiting into an open-air circular basin which sends Riders spiraling in circles. Once momentum subsides, the ride continues into one last enclosed flume before finishing in a 36" (92 cm) depth splash pool. Riders will experience high speeds and rapid movements from side-to-side.

Rider Criteria: Guests must be seated in a tube, facing forward, and firmly grasping the handles throughout the ride. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a tube. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Bonzai Pipeline



Guests must be at least 42" tall in bare feet to ride.

Slide tower contains two single Rider, serpentine body slides.

Rider Criteria: Guests are required to lie down on their back, feet first, with arms crossed across their chest and legs crossed at the ankles. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, or broken collarbone are not permitted to ride. Casts are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the area may be slippery.

Buccaneer Beach 2



Guests must be less than 54" tall in bare feet to ride **or** be accompanied by a child. Guests over 54" tall are not permitted on the slides.

An interactive pool for children which features slides, water cannons, and other play elements. Maximum water depth is 24".

Rider Criteria: Guests are required to slide upright or lying feet first. Guests who do not have seated postural control or appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held Infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing a few steps. Riders will have to be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Hurricane Bay 2



Life jackets are required for Guests who are less than 52" tall in bare feet, participants with a history of seizures (or similar medical conditions), heart conditions, or those who are inexperienced or non-swimmers. Children who are less than 42" tall must wear life jackets **and** be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. A Supervising Companion may accompany up to two Guests.

A large wave pool with depths ranging from 0ft. (0cm) to 6ft. 183 (cm). Waves are generated for five minutes on, and then five minutes off. Strenuous activity is required during wave action cycles which may require the ability to swim and which may result in fatigue. **Exercise Caution.** Participants with a history of seizures – or heart or other serious medical conditions – should be supervised by someone who knows how to swim and how to provide emergency assistance.

Rider Criteria: Guests must be able to maintain independent seated postural control and must have appropriate observed behavior or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests must have a minimum of two functioning extremities or be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants participation or water depth may be restricted if necessary and must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Guests with a full arm cast or full leg cast are welcome to enjoy the attraction, but participation or water depth may be restricted, if necessary. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, or braced arm cast cannot participate.

Rider Access: To participate in a Wave Pool, a Guest who is non-ambulatory must wear a life jacket and be accompanied by a Supervising Companion if they do not have an assistive device - wheelchair, walker, or cane. A Guest in a wheelchair will not be required to wear a life jacket if their height exceeds 42". Guests in either water wheelchairs or personal wheelchairs will be asked to not utilize the wheelchair's seatbelts while in the Wave Pool. Personal wheelchairs are permitted in wave pools up to the water depth of the seat. Walkers and canes may be permitted in wave pools up to ankle depth.

Paradise Plunge



Guests must be at least 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum weight 300 lb per rider.

One single Rider partially enclosed body slide that ends in a 6" runout. Maximum one Rider per slide.

Rider Criteria: Guests are required to lie down on their back, feet first, with arms crossed across their chest and legs crossed at the ankles. Guests must have two functioning arms and two functioning legs. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the area may be slippery.

Shipwreck Cove 1



Guests must be less than 54" tall in bare feet to ride **or** be accompanied by a child. Guests over 54" tall are not permitted on the slides.

An interactive pool for children which features water cannons and other play elements. Maximum water depth is 12".

Rider Criteria: Guests who do not have seated postural control or appropriate observed behavior must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion. Hand-held infants must be accompanied by a Supervising Companion.

Rider Access: Access is available via the zero-depth entry. This attraction is wheelchair accessible, although the water level may not exceed the height of the seat on the chair.

Splashwater Island 3



Guests must be at least 42" tall in bare feet to ride.

Four open single rider serpentine body slides ending in a 36" catch pool and one in a 12" pool.

Rider Criteria: Guests are required to lie down on their back, feet first, with arms crossed across their chest and legs crossed at the ankles. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the area may be slippery.

Tornado 5



Guests must be at least 48" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum Weight – 700 lb per tube.

Cloverleaf tubes take Riders twisting and turning into complete darkness before dropping vertically into a funnel. The tube will slide back and forth in the funnel before finally ending in a 36" splash pool.

Rider Criteria: Guests must be seated in the tube with feet in the middle, facing forward, sitting up straight, and holding on to both handles. Minimum two guests; maximum four guests. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities; two functioning arms and one functioning leg. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Lower body casts (foot, lower leg, etc.) are not permitted on this ride.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a tube. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the tube, on their own or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the tube may shift. The tube and surrounding area may also be slippery.

Typhoon Twister



Guest must be at least 42" tall to ride.

Minimum Weight per raft 120lb Maximum Weight per raft 350 lb.

Enclosed serpentine tube slides ending in a run out.

Rider Criteria: Guests must sit facing forward in a tube, holding onto the tube handles with legs extended forward. The smaller Rider needs to sit in the front of the tube. Guests must have a minimum of three functioning extremities. Forearm casts, full arm casts, braced arm casts, foot or lower leg casts, full leg casts, cervical collars or neck braces, or broken collarbones are not permitted.

Rider Access: Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own, or with the assistance of a companion. Please use caution when entering and exiting as the tube may shift. The tube and surrounding area may also be slippery.

Wahoo Racer



Guests must be at least 42" tall in bare feet to ride.

Maximum one Rider per mat per slide.

A mat racing slide where rival sliders compete for first place as they descend the slide before finishing in a runout. Riders will experience high speeds.

Rider Access: Access to the attraction requires climbing several flights of stairs with a mat. Riders will have to ascend the slide tower and be capable of safely entering the slide, on their own or with the assistance of a companion.

Rider Criteria: Guests must lie stomach down on a mat, facing forward, and firmly grasping the handles throughout the ride with elbows tucked in towards the body. Guests must have two functioning arms and two functioning legs. Guests with a cervical collar, neck brace, broken collarbone, full arm cast, braced arm cast, or full leg cast are not permitted to ride. Riders must demonstrate appropriate observed behavior.

ENTERTAINMENT VENUES

Due to the popularity of our shows, we suggest you arrive early as seating may be limited. Show schedules are available at Guest Services, on the Six Flags Great Escape mobile app, and at any theater entrance. All Entertainment venues are accessible to Guests who may have a mobility impairment. Assisted listening devices are available for Guests who are hearing impaired at each theater. Large print scripts may also be available. Ask any Associate at the venue for assistance.

Storytown Stage

Storytown Stage is located in Carousel Plaza, it is an outdoor arena featuring many different theatrical shows. There are viewing areas that accommodate wheelchairs at the top of the venue. Please ask an Associate for assistance.
